



Community Health Update - February 3, 2021

C&R RESIDENT TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

A resident of the Convalescent and Rehabilitation Center has tested positive for COVID-19. The test was taken on Monday, February 1st as part of the routine weekly testing for all C&R residents and staff. The result was received today, February 3rd. Some of the results from this round of tests are still pending but at the time this notice was published, the results are as follows: 1 positive, 285 negative, 17 still pending.

The resident is not experiencing any symptoms. In accordance with our COVID-19 Infectious Disease Outbreak Procedures, the resident has been moved to a quarantine room away from other residents.

The Convalescent & Rehabilitation Center has been placed on Outbreak Monitoring as determined by the Department of Health. This includes the following measures:

- Residents are isolating in their rooms with limited movement in the hallways. All dining and therapy services must take place in the resident's room.
- No visitors are permitted. The Department of Health has approved our C&R leadership to make exceptions for individual end of life situations.
- No admissions are permitted until the C&R undergoes two rounds of weekly testing with zero positive results.

Because this resident is not experiencing symptoms, they have had no outings, and all individuals who interacted with them have tested negative, there is a possibility this result is a false positive. As such, we are following guidance from the Department of Health to do a series of retesting for this resident in the upcoming days. If every retest returns negative results, the Department of Health will deem this a false positive and the Outbreak Monitoring period will end.
